ISSUE FOCUS: OPIOIDS

Policies backed by NACDS are supported by voters. Among these policies, 75% support limiting the initial fill of certain opioid prescriptions to seven days, and 75% support rules that all prescriptions must be handled electronically, rather than paper or fax prescriptions.

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This poll was conducted from January 16-29, 2018, among a national sample of 20,429 registered voters. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 1 percentage points.
